Pics or it didn't happen! A photographer's job during the festival weekend is more than just taking pictures. In this document, we break down the tasks that come with the position.

During the festival you will take photos of different performances based on a schedule. You will wear a CTF t-shirt and CTF pass, which, in combination with your camera, enables you to move freely from location to location.

There are 24 hospitality establishments participating in the Café Theater Festival 2022. Each location has one performing artist/group, and they each perform between eight and ten times during the weekend. Each location has a volunteer assigned as a location manager that will be able to answer all your questions about said location.

Preparation

You ensure that you know in advance what the lighting and layout of the location is like and that you're on time. You check with the location manager where the performers are performing and how the performance is going. Make sure the performers know you're there and that you're walking around during the performance.

Working In A Full Location

Taking pictures during the CTF has its challenges. Not only do the performers move around the hospitality establishment while performing, but the location can also get really packed. It's up to you to navigate the situation and capture the performance in the best possible way.

At the start of your shift, you report at the CTF festival office, the organization's operating base during the festival. Maarten, the chief photographer will meet you there and he will provide you with the right equipment to perform your task.

Posting Photos

At the end of your shift, you will edit the 10 best photos and send them to us right away, so that we have good pictures to share on our social media accounts throughout the weekend.

By working in this way, (potential) visitors immediately get a good impression of the festival when visiting our accounts. You'll have the time to go through the rest of your photos at a quieter moment, during which you will remove duplicates and blurry (or otherwise bad) photos and put the remaining photos in the appropriate folders.

Photos are uploaded – under a creative common license – and shared online with mention of your name.
